## INCIDENTS AND INJURIES UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH

An accident is an unplanned occurrence that may result in damage to people, property, equipment, or the environment. When accidents are reported promptly, injured employees, students, and visitors receive timely medical care and unsafe conditions receive prompt corrective action.

University employees should report all on-the-job accidents, injuries, or illnesses to **1-800-633-1197 (UPMC Work Partners)** and provide as much information as you can about the injury or illness.

If emergency medical treatment is required, call University Police [412-624-2121 Pittsburgh Campus].

If an on-the-job injury involves a bloodborne pathogen exposure (such as a needle stick or blood/body fluid splash), or involves an animal or occurs in an animal facility, medical treatment must be obtained at:
